**Perk's Picks** — Father Richard Rohr, a priest of the Order of Saint Francis (a Franciscan) and a very prominent author in the area of Christian Spirituality, is the founder and director of a reflection, spiritual renewal center in Arizona. I am re-reading his latest, and I think most insightful book — Falling Upward: The Two Halves of Spiritual Life. It is a very practical, ordinary spirituality into which Fr. Rohr invites the reader, and he offers many “profound nuggets of wisdom” to reflect upon, which may well challenge the typical spiritual presuppositions we are living out of. As July unfolds, I hope to offer a three-session reading group based upon this book -- perhaps if there is enough interest, one in the morning and one in the evening.
