FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR —

Holy Communion — Every time Catholics celebrate the eucharist, part of the prayer remembers all the women and men designated “Saints” by the Church; and as well we remember all others who have died and gone before us. However, annually the Church sets aside two days -- **All Saints Day**, November 1st, and **All Souls Day**, November 2nd -- when we honor and remember in a special way the Saints and the Dead. November 1st is a holy day of obligation, and we will celebrate eucharist at 8:30 A.M. and 7:00 P.M. November 2nd we will celebrate eucharist at 8:30 A.M., and at 7:00 P.M. we will celebrate evening prayer. If you come to eucharist or the prayer service on All Souls Day, please bring a photo of a loved one or any object that reminds you of that person. (We will display these as we pray on November 2nd.) Let us forever be in “Holy Communion”!

Bishop DiLorenzo Visit — Our Bishop is making an effort to visit every parish and mission in our Diocese. Bishop Francis will come here to ICC on Sunday, November 11th. He will preside at the 11:00 A.M. eucharist, have a short lunch with the Parish Leadership Council and staff; and lead a meeting of all interested parish members beginning about 1:00 P.M. Bishop is trying to get a “fuller pulse” of the Diocese. All are most welcome to come, listen and share your thoughts about parish life.

Express Your Prayer — As you enter our worship space, on the right side just beyond the daily chapel is an alcove. Here is where the three holy oil vessels are displayed. And now there are two books to be used to express the prayer in your heart. The Parish **Book of Remembrance** is used to inscribe the name of a family member or friend. You are invited to write the name of someone who has died recently, or if as you come to worship and someone is very “alive” in your heart (perhaps on the anniversary of someone's death or their date of birth), you are invited to inscribe their name -- even if you have done so previously.

The Book of Intercessions is also displayed there. Whenever you enter the worship space you are invited to write any prayer you wish — a prayer of need, or praise, or thanksgiving -- perhaps you will “lift up” someone who is sick or facing surgery -- a prayer for peace in places of conflict, or a prayer for the safety of a loved one in the military, or a prayer of thanks for a couple's wedding anniversary.

BOTH BOOKS WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE GENERAL INTERCESSIONS (PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL) AT SUNDAY AND DAILY EUCHARISTS.
